NIPUN field team consistently mobilizes the communities and stakeholders in the slum areas to sensitize them and raise awareness among the needy people on education, health, skill, income enhancement /livelihoods, community sanitation and community based rehabilitation programmes. The team also regularly strengthens community participation for self-reliance and sustainable development for the upliftment of underprivileged section of the society. Apart from the above, the team assists in the service delivery of resources at the door-steps of the needy.

NIPUN through active community mobilization has continuously worked towards identifying real needs of the communities and provided opportunities to achieve common goal and actively participate in education, skills, community health and women empowerment activities. Community mobilization has immensely helped empowering of the communities and enable them to initiate and steer their own development, therefore making the discourse more participative.

During the community mobilization, NIPUN field members conduct door to door counselling, group counselling, corner meetings, poster campaign, street plays and stakeholders meetings which have proved to be extremely useful tools.







NIPUN Admission - "Aao Ham Sab School Chalein" Campaign

In a heartwarming initiative, the NIPUN - Empowering Girl Child Project in West Delhi has successfully mainstreamed children into Municipal Corporation Schools and Delhi Government Schools. To further this cause, NIPUN organized the "Aa Ham Sab School Chalein" campaign within the slum communities, creating an atmosphere of enthusiasm and hope.

The vibrant campaign utilized colorful posters adorned with uplifting slogans such as "Shikhit Parivar, Khushi Parivar" (Educated Family, Happy Family) and "Beta Beti Ek Saman, Sabko Shiksha Sabko Gyan". These messages resonated deeply within the community, fostering a collective spirit of progress and equality.

During the awareness drive, the NIPUN project team called upon the entire community to join hands and ensure every child's enrollment in school by organising rallies and sloganeering: "Aao Milkar Hath Badhayein, Sabhi Bachho ka School Me Nam Likhayein" (Let's Join Hands Together, Enroll All Children in School). Parents eagerly inquired about the admission system and procedures, particularly those who lacked birth certificates for their children. In response, NIPUN organized dedicated counseling sessions to guide families through the necessary steps and requirements for MCD/Government School admissions.

This admission campaign is thriving within the slum communities, where NIPUN tirelessly works towards the holistic development of children. The campaign's success redefines the power of community-driven initiatives in transforming lives and building a brighter future for all.



Promoting Healthy Habits and Savings Among Children at Our Centers

Like all parents, those of the children enrolled at our centers also give their children pocket money, albeit a small amount, such as Rs. 10. However, this pocket money has often been spent on junk food, candies, etc., which poses a health hazard for the children.

To address this issue, NIPUN recently organized a sensitization program to develop a savings habit among the children.

NIPUN also distributed piggy banks (Gullak) to all the children, which they beautifully painted and have now started to save money.

Awareness Campaign to Combat Domestic Violence Against Women

An awareness campaign titled "Raise Voice to Stop Domestic Violence Against Women" was held in Jhuggi Jhopari Basti, Meera Bagh, and Bengali Camp. Ms. Anjana Matta served as the resource person for the event. During the discussions, participants passionately shared their views and personal experiences of domestic violence, often linked to financial crises, daily alcohol consumption, and the surrounding environment. The campaign also addressed various critical issues, including violence against women, legal protections for women, gender equality, gender discrimination, female foeticide, eve-teasing, and domestic violence.

Discussions on the Prevention of Malnutrition Amongst Children

Malnutrition makes children more vulnerable to severe diseases. Chronic malnutrition, or stunting, prevents children from growing and developing properly, eventually making them too short for their age due to inadequate nourishment, care, and living in unhygienic environments. This can have a devastating and permanent impact on a child's physical and cognitive abilities.

Addressing this issue, a discussion on the prevention of malnutrition among children, particularly girls, was organized recently, as part of the Empowering Girl Child Project implemented by NIPUN at project locations in West Delhi. During the sessions, the following topics were discussed in detail with mothers' groups: Causes of malnutrition, Prevention methods, Low-cost balanced diets for children from birth to 6 years old, especially girls, Regular growth monitoring, Health and hygiene practices, Diarrhea control, Cooking methods

Experts in community health facilitated the sessions using a participatory approach. The mothers' groups found the discussions, practical sessions, and case study presentations both enjoyable and educational, gaining valuable insights and lessons from the fruitful discussions.



Enhancing Math Skills through Innovative Education at NIPUN

At NIPUN, we regularly organize mathematics classes with innovative teaching materials and blackboards for remedial and bridge education for children in slum communities and construction sites. Besides routine classes, our educators conduct weekly and monthly assessments to build and strengthen students' math skills. During these classes, learners actively and enthusiastically practice math problems on the blackboard and with teaching materials in peer groups.



This hands-on approach is crucial for building individual capacity and boosting confidence. We have observed that learners show tremendous potential; they engage keenly with the questions and respond with great eagerness during blackboard exercises.

Swavalamban Evening Health Clinic Run By NIPUN

To enhance the quality of life for the large migrant labour population in and around Kapashera, South West Delhi, NIPUN operates the 'Swavalamban Evening Clinic' as a charitable initiative that provides quality preventive and curative healthcare, specifically targeting daily wage earners and migrant workers employed in small, medium, and micro enterprises. The clinic features specialized doctors who offer consultations on designated days. Regular health camps are organized, including general health check-ups, eye exams, and focused sessions on gynecology, child care, and cataract referrals. These camps are vital as they provide an opportunity for individuals who may neglect illness symptoms to receive timely medical attention and treatment. Additionally, the clinic conducts workshops to educate the community about the causes, consequences, and prevention of common diseases. Overall, the Swavalamban Evening Clinic serves as a crucial resource for low-income and underprivileged community members, granting them access to specialized medical care and essential medicines. Last month alone, the clinic registered over 400 patients and facilitated successful cataract surgery for four beneficiaries, underscoring its significant impact on improving community health.

Awareness on Hygiene and Health

Empowering Transgender Communities

The Delhi State AIDS Control Society (DSACS), Government of NCT of Delhi, in collaboration with NACO, USAID, PEPFAR, and SATTVA - Community Led Monitoring, organized a State Level Stakeholder Consultation & Training on Community Champions at Vishwa Yuvak Kendra, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi, on July 25, 2024. The event aimed to strengthen the HIV/AIDS response in high-burden states in India.

NIPUN is implementing a Targeted Intervention project in the South West District of Delhi, focusing on high-risk groups, specifically the transgender community.

The project's objective is to develop an integrated service delivery model through a one-stop center to promote comprehensive HIV services along with social protection support for the transgender community.







The NIPUN Targeted Intervention project increases access to comprehensive STI/HIV services for at-risk populations, addressing other health and social needs under one roof in a stigma-and discrimination-free environment. It aims to boost community ownership, participation, strengthen networks, and create an enabling environment. NIPUN was awarded a memento, which was received by Mr. Mohit Srivastava, Program Manager of the NIPUN TG-TI project.

Trainee Judicial Officers Visit NIPUN

At NIPUN, the Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLSA) and the Delhi Judicial Academy conducted a legal awareness session and field visit for 12 trainee judicial officers in the Meera Bagh and Bengali Camp slum communities of the West District.
